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INTRODUCTION TO MORR

Rushford has partnered with the City of Meriden to help combat the opioid crisis that the State of Connecticut and the City of Meriden are experiencing.

Meriden Opioid Referral for Recovery (MORR) project focuses on first responders using Narcan to reverse opioid overdose and then connecting that individual to the specialized team of MORR staff who are embedded in Rushford's Crisis Team.

Rushford will provide direct access to a clinician who will help guide the individual on their path to recovery. In addition, Rushford will provide clients in the MORR program with a case manager. Rushford will offer a peer trained Recovery Support Specialist as well as a bilingual case manager for Meriden's large Spanish-speaking population. The team will provide support, connect people to needed resources, and assist with any other needs the individual may have.

WHAT CAN MORR DO FOR YOU?

MORR is designed to work with adults and adolescents in the City of Meriden who have recently experienced an overdose or are struggling with addiction. MORR works with the individual affected by the overdose

as well as families. MORR staff will provide support and can connect family members, spouses, or friends to services in order to help begin their recovery process.

MORR will connect people to clinical treatment as well as an array of community support services. This may include connection to community groups such as Narcotics Anonymous (NA), Alcoholics Anonymous (AA), Al-Anon, and SMART Recovery.

HOW DO WE GET INVOLVED?

A majority of MORR's referrals will come from first responders in the City of Meriden. You can also access MORR by going to your local police department or fire department and inquiring about the MORR program.
