



SENSORY GARDEN FEATURES COVERED BY DEEP GRANT:

STREAMSIDE EXPLORATION TRAIL

- Stone slab stream crossing
- Paver plaza
- Trail of permeable pavement
- Aggregate concrete trail
- Wetland plantings
- Boulders, traps and wetlands plantings and grasses

ECOLOGICAL GARDEN & FOOD FOREST

- At Green and Cedar Street
- Buffer plantings and a mix of evergreen and deciduous trees
- Raised planters with plats that are edible, have aromas, and stimulate other senses
- Will educate on the value of plants and food sources and the characteristics of plants
- Quiet space for learning

TOUCH GARDEN

- One side accessible to wheelchair via retaining wall that raises the garden to various heights
- Wide, flexible pavement pathway adjacent to the wall with arm-height garden.
- Varying textures, colors and shapes encouraging active participation
